Exhibit: "Step Back into a 1950s Valentines Day," February 1– March 4, 2017. This year the exhibit includes a very **special display of Antique Valentines dating from 1880 up to 1950**, and Valentines decorative items through the decades. Jim St. Ledger of Chicago Heights donated his wife's collection to the Society a few years ago. Karen Blackful has designed this lovely display for us.
