New donations to our collections. We received a WWII collection including uniform jacket and insignia from the estate of James Dougherty II, who lived in Park Forest until his death in 1959. We hope to do a display of the collection to show the life of a WWII soldier. We thank Betty Dougherty who drove from Loves Park, Illinois to donate it.

Yearbooks and reunion materials were received from the estates of Ed and Bob Zuckerman from their brother Stuart. Neil Devore donated an Annabelle Gould painting of a local farmstand. Come in and see if you can tell us where it was. Judy Kaufer Safcik donated Passover Haggadah booklets by Maxwell House to be used in our Judaism in Park Forest display. Cynthia Ogorek donated several of her dolls and clothes which had been loaned for "Boomer Toys and Dolls." Ed Kravitz donated a 40" x 30" hand-tinted aerial of Park Forest rental areas before Sears came in ca. 1962, which is on display. My parents' wedding outfits from November 19, 1942 have been on display. I hope to add some of their letters. May be by Veteran's Day?! They never lived in Park Forest, but their lives paralleled those of so many who did come here to live. My father's uniform jacket and hats have been on display for 20 years. I have just added photos of them in these clothes.
