

WELCOME NEW SOCIETY PRESIDENT, CHRIS JANOTA

At our October 2022 meeting, Chris Janota became our ninth President. He was a resident of Park Forest early in life. His grandparents had lived here since 1952 and made many contributions to the village.

Chris is the grandson of Ray and Deloris Janota. Ray was the first teacher hired at Rich Township High and chose the school colors. Deloris established the speech pathology program for District 163. His father is Bill Janota.

Chris contacted us to join the board as a tribute to his grandparents' love for Park Forest and was surprised to



learn Ray had been an early and longtime member of the board and had designed the Hall of Fame logo. Chris is our first descendant of a former board member to serve.

Chris received an economics degree from Northern Illinois University and is the founder and President of Envoy Wealth Management in Crown Point, Indiana. He and wife Megan reside in Northwest Indiana.

In June 2022 his accomplishments were recognized by InvestmentNews, which nominated Chris into their Top 40 Under 40 Award for 2022.

The board appreciates Chris for his business acumen, his experience handling things financial and for his willingness to take on any task he has been asked to do. He has inherited the kindness and sense of humor we knew with Ray and Deloris, who were longtime active members and volunteers for the Society.

Chris has been the one who has taken PFHS into the YouTube realm and has labored long and hard to get our programs launched.

PARK FOREST HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS BEING ACCEPTED

until December 31, 2022. The official form, which **must** accompany nominations, is available at the 1950s Park Forest House Museum, when it's open, at

the Archive, 227 Monee Road on Friday 10-12, in the Village Hall lobby, at the Park Forest Public Library, or on the website at parkforesthistory.org. **We are not mailing the form to all this year.**



If you can not get it off the computer, let us know and we will send one out. Nominations may be mailed or delivered in person to 227 Monee Road.

To be eligible for the Hall of Fame, persons nominated must have made substantial, beneficial, and consistent contributions to the life and well being of Park Forest over a considerable span of time.

Nominees may now live elsewhere, or be deceased. Individuals or couples may be nominated. The person making the nomination does not have to live in

Park Forest, or be a member of the society.

Persons may only make one nomination each year.

Separate sheets indicating why the person is being nominated, and in convincing and thorough detail, describing the nominee's qualifications and contributions which fit the criteria must be attached to the required nomination form. A list of those already in the Hall of Fame is on the reverse of the form or on the website.

Inductees will be chosen by the Park Forest Historical Society, and announced early in 2023. The induction ceremony is scheduled for Sunday, April 16, 2023. It may be

in person at Freedom Hall, or it may be videotaped and aired on YouTube
