- History Programs, free to the public, in September, November, February, and June like the history of
  the Holiday Theatre from the 1950s Grand Opening to the present. Our next free program is Sunday,

  free give-a-ways, refreshments, and will tell the history of the 1950s Park Forest House Museum over

- Park Forest Archive Office. Donations to our Annual Fund Drive, and assistance from the Park Forest Public Library, made it possible in January to move the archive out of remote storage, and open the Park Forest Archive Office in St. Mary's Catholic School, 227 Monee Road. In June we held an Open House. The Archive is now accessible to the public, Friday 10-12, or by appointment.
- <u>Our annual Hall of Fame Induction</u> each spring, honors those who have contributed to our community over a long period of time. Besides the 130+ individuals inducted to date, the Society has recognized Aunt Martha's, and Tall Grass Arts Association.
- 1950s Park Forest House Museum remains open to the public, in spite of many challenges. In June 2011 our landlord required us to gradually increase our scheduled hours from two to ten per week. We have successfully met this challenge, but need more volunteers to continue. In June 2012, our lease jumped from \$315 to \$534 per month. We have begun searching for a new museum location. Suggestions are welcome.


And we need dollars to do it! Your continuing membership each year helps us so much.
