Park Forest History Where is it Found?

The Park Forest Historical Society founded in 1985, became an independent 501(c)(3) corporation in 1989. Its mission was to support the Local History Collection and Archive of the Park Forest Public Library, started by the Reference Staff in 1981. In January 2007, the Archive was moved to remote storage by the library. In January 2012, the Archive, our office and the digital lab moved into the Archive Office, 227 Monee Road, (inside St. Mary's Catholic Church) supported by the Park Forest Public Library and the Society.

The Local History Files, circulating copies of the Oral History transcripts, and scrapbooks moved to the Museum in 2016. The Archive Office has the photograph collection, and ca. 185 linear feet of documents, newspapers and some objects. Governors State University Library has the newspaper microfilm and has digitized documents.

At present, the Society is seeking a permanent home for the archival collection, office and the digital computer lab.

The Society runs the 1950s Park Forest House Museum and Archive Office at 227 Monee Road, where photos and documents are on display. For more information on our story, what our past and current programs are, and how you can help, visit
